

New Lease of Life for Rural Water Bodies with Pond Modernisation

TSIT, Visakhapatnam
The State Government is taking up extensive modernisation of water bodies across Andhra Pradesh with the objectives of conserving irrigation resources, improving groundwater levels, protecting the environment and providing better recreational facilities for rural communities. The initiative has gained momentum through the efforts of Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan and support under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY). A total of 105 ponds are being modernised across the

State at an estimated cost of around Rs.50 crore. So far, works on 26 ponds have been completed and the renovated water bodies have been made available to the public. The works have been completed in several districts, including Anantapur, Painadu, Sri Sathya Sai, Chittoor, Kurnool, Sri Potti Srimamulu Nellore, Kakinada and Guntur, while works on the remaining ponds are progressing at various stages. As part of the modernisation, pond bunds are being strengthened and facilities such as walking tracks, entrance gates,



solar lighting, seating benches, children's parks and open-air gyms are being developed. The objective is to transform

the ponds into attractive community spaces that support recreation, health and leisure, apart from strengthening their role as

water resources. Among the ponds already developed are Vedula Cheruvu in Kuppam constituency of Chittoor district, Panduru Cheruvu in Kakinada Rural constituency, Vengalayapalem Cheruvu in Guntur district, Gudiselapalli Cheruvu in Anantapur district, Vinjamuru Cheruvu in Nellore district and Palasamudram Cheruvu in Sri Sathya Sai district. The modernisation programme is expected to increase water storage capacity, strengthen irrigation resources and contribute to the improve-

ment of groundwater levels in surrounding areas. It will also benefit farmers by improving the availability of water for cultivation and contribute to environmental conservation and ecological balance. Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan is also giving special emphasis to the quality of the works, besides ensuring their timely completion. Officials have been directed to maintain quality standards and complete the remaining works by the end of September so that the facilities can be made available to the public at the earliest.

Ration syndicate tightens grip in Vijayawada West

Vijayawada: The illegal smuggling and recycling of subsidized ration rice are rampant in the West constituency, with a notorious kingpin turning it into an organized syndicate. 'Koti', who previously dominated the Central constituency, has reportedly shifted his base of operations to the West, establishing himself as the undisputed 'Ration Don' of the area. Allegations are flying thick and fast that nearly all fair price shops (ration stores) in the constituency have been forcibly brought under his control. Coercion and Targeted Raids Sources reveal a chilling modus operandi: ration dealers are given a flat ultimatum to hand over the subsidized rice to Koti's syndicate. Those who refuse to cooperate with the syndicate. *The Price Breakdown: * Smuggling Economics Koti, notorious for his ability to 'manage' enforcement systems, has set up a highly profitable network that loots essential commodities meant for the poor. The financial supply chain of this illegal trade operates as follows: Procurement from Cardholders: Rice is bought from poor beneficiaries at Rs.12 per kg. Dealer's Cut: The ration dealer receives an additional margin of Rs.2 per kg. Broker's Commission: The middleman facilitating the deal pockets another Rs.2 per kg. The Don's Lion's Share: The accumulated bulk stock is then diverted to the black market, fetching massive, multi-crore profit margins for Koti. Having depleted resources in the Central constituency, Koti's aggressive expansion into the West has left local ration dealers terrified. Demands are growing louder from both locals and honest dealers for a high-level independent inquiry into this ration mafia and the complicit vigilance officers enabling it.

KIMS Doctors Help 30-Year-Old Avoid Liver Transplant with Minimally Invasive Treatment



Rare Budd-Chiari syndrome diagnosed after advanced vascular imaging; hepatic blood flow restored through balloon venoplasty and stenting

Hyderabad, September 4, 2026: Doctors at KIMS Hospitals, Kondapur, have helped a 30-year-old man from Visakhapatnam avoid a liver transplant after diagnosing and treating a rare vascular condition known as Budd-Chiari syndrome. The patient had suffered from severe and recurrent ascites, or accumulation of fluid in the abdomen, for nearly a year. He had initially been suspected to have advanced liver disease, with his history of alcohol consumption considered a possible cause, and was advised to undergo liver transplantation. Seeking a second opinion at KIMS Kondapur, he underwent detailed evaluation by a multi-disciplinary team of interventional radiologists and medical gastroenterologists. Advanced vascular imaging revealed severe narrowing and complete blockage of the

major hepatic veins, which drain blood from the liver. A clot was also detected in an accessory left hepatic vein that was providing an alternative drainage pathway. Instead of proceeding directly to transplantation, the KIMS team attempted to restore hepatic venous blood flow. The interventional radiology team accessed the partially patent accessory hepatic vein through a minimally invasive procedure. Balloon venoplasty was performed to widen the narrowed segment, followed by placement of a metallic stent to maintain blood flow. The procedure successfully restored venous drainage from the liver without major surgery. The patient recovered well and was discharged on medication under medical supervision. At a one-month follow-up, his recurrent ascites had completely resolved and liver function tests showed significant improvement. Dr. Mahesh Kumar Thummu, Interventional Radiologist, KIMS Hospitals, Kondapur, said Budd-Chiari syndrome can be difficult to identify because its symptoms may resemble common forms of liver cirrhosis.

Traditional Handicrafts to Get a Modern Makeover

TSIT, Visakhapatnam : With changing consumer preferences and growing demand for handicraft products, the Central and State Governments are taking steps to strengthen the livelihoods and financial security of artisans in Andhra Pradesh. Training programmes are being launched to enhance the skills of handicraft artisans and enable them to create traditional art forms with contemporary designs. Handlooms and Textiles Minister S. Savita said the Central Government has sanctioned Rs.1,35,16,314 for the training programmes, which will benefit around 770 handicraft artisans across the State. Depending on the craft,



training will be provided for one or two months through cluster-based programmes. The Minister said the State Government, under

the leadership of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, has already been implementing several initiatives to strengthen the handloom sector and

increase the sales of handloom products. Similar measures are now being extended to handicraft artisans to improve their skills, income and employment opportunities with the support of the Central Government. As part of the programme, artisans engaged in various traditional crafts will receive training through Guru-Shishya Hast Shilp Prashikshan (GHPP) and Design Development Workshops (DDW). GHPP training will generally be conducted for two months, while DDW programmes will be conducted for one month. Training in wooden toy making under the DDW programme will also be conducted for two months.

Congress Stages 'Kumbhakarna' Protest Against KCR Motha Rohith Mudhiraj



Hyderabad TSIT: Khairatabad District Congress Committee on Friday staged a novel protest against former Chief Minister and BRS president K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), accusing him of remaining dis-

connected from the people and their problems for the past 1,000 days. Led by Khairatabad District Congress President Motha Rohith Mudhiraj, Congress leaders and workers took out a rally from Gandhi Bhavan to Gun Park. As part of the protest, they displayed a huge cutout depicting KCR as the mythological character Kumbhakarna, symbolising what they described as his prolonged political "slumber". Addressing the protest, Rohith Mudhiraj alleged that KCR had distanced himself from the people and confined himself to his farmhouse instead of playing an active role as an elected representative. "KCR has been in deep slumber for the past 1,000 days without paying attention to the problems faced by the people.
