People with dementia fail to get post-diagnosis care

UP to 85 per cent of the over 55 million people living with dementia may not receive post-diagnosis care, states the World Alzheimer's Report 2022: Life after diagnosis: Navigating Treatment, Care and Support.

KEY FINDINGS OF 2022 ADI REPORT

A surprising number of people living with dementia indicated they had not been offered post-diagnosis support, beyond initial information

64% of respondents indicated they didn't have a personalised care plan as their condition progressed

Informal carers said stress was a very common factor while trying to cope with responsibilities

RECOMMENDATIONS OF ADI REPORT

Make national dementia plans a policy priority

Provide person-centred, culturally-appropriate, gender-inclusive care, supported by trained personnel

Improve and expand education

Stigma to be further challenged

The World Alzheimer's Report has called for urgent improvements to post-diagnosis treatment, care and support services for over 55 million people living with dementia across the globe, and plans to support the forecast of 139 million people by 2050.

"We don't question whether people with cancer need treatment, so why is it that when people receive a dementia diagnosis, they're often not offered treatment or care? They're just told to get their end-of-life affairs in order," said ADI CEO Paola Barbarino.

Mystery shrouds death of woman, boyfriend

A 23-year-old private firm employee and her boyfriend were found dead under mysterious circumstances at her rented house in Hebbagodi police limits. The incident came to light on Tuesday.

The bodies of Netravathi and Mallikarjun (27) were found at her house on Hebbagodi Main Road. Mallikarjun was hanging from the ceiling,

while Netravathi, who had vomited, was lying dead on the floor, after consuming some poison.

Both were from KR Pet in Mandya district and were in a relationship since their college days. Netravathi was working as a helper at a company in Hebbagodi Industrial Area, while Mallikarjun was a painter in his hometown.

KAS officer caught while returning bribe

USUALLY, Lokayukta police lay a trap and arrest the accused while accepting a bribe. But in a reverse case on Wednesday, they trapped a KAS officer and land surveyor, both attached to KIADB,

The first accused is AB Vijayakumar, Special Land Acquisition Officer-II, and second accused is Raghunath, land surveyor, attached to the office of the first accused.

The officials demanded Rs 2.50 lakh bribe to issue NoC to the complainant, Bhagath Singh Arun. Later, they issued an NoC after taking a bribe of Rs 2.50 lakh.

Arun lodged a complaint with the KIADB DC (Land Acquisition). Then they two requested Arun to take back the bribe, along with Rs 50,000, and withdraw the complaint.

SC/ST panel cannot pass order on grants: HC

THE Karnataka High Court quashed the order passed by the Karnataka State Commission of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, directing the state government to withhold grants being made to Sri Vasavi Education Society for demoting a headmaster who belongs to Scheduled Caste, to the post of teacher, on charges of misconduct.

Justice MI Arun passed the order while allowing the petition filed by Vasavi Education Society, Hosapete of Vjayanagar, challenging the Commission's order dated September 16, 2021. It was based on a complaint filed by H Hanumantha from Hosapete.

The court said the Commission is constituted under Section 8 of the Karnataka State Commission of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled

Tribes Act, and Section 8(B) of the Act provided powers to inquire into specific complaints with respect to deprivation of rights, and safeguard those who belong to SC and ST, and take up such matters with the appropriate authorities. But the clause does not empower the Commission to direct the authorities to withhold grants made in favour of an institution, as done in this case, the court added.

REPORT ON CET RANKING TO BE SUBMITTED TO HC TODAY

The HC-mandated report on CET ranking was submitted to the government on Wednesday, and will be submitted before the court on Thursday. The HC asked the government to constitute a panel and prepare a coordination formula to sort out the issue of CET rankings, following an appeal filed by the government on problems of students who wrote CET.
