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# 45 die of 'sunstroke' in Odisha in 24 hours; 141 fatalities recorded so far

A total of 99 suspected heatstroke deaths have been reported in the state in last 72 hours

THE suspected sunstroke death toll in Odisha stood at 141 on Sunday with the state recording 45 more fatalities in the last 24 hours. As the state continued to bear the brunt of the blistering conditions, western districts remained the epicentre.

According to the Special Relief Commissioner's (SRC) office, a total of 99 suspected heatstroke deaths were reported in the last 72 hours. Of the total suspected heatstroke deaths in the last three days, 20 cases have been confirmed by collectors of various districts basing on post-mortem and joint inquiry reports, while it was ascertained two cases were not due to sunstroke.

"During this summer, reports of 141 alleged sunstroke deaths have been reported by various district collectors. So far. 26 deaths have been confirmed due to sunstroke and eight are caused by other rea-

sons," said the SRC's office. Around 107 alleged cases are pending inquiry at the district level. Meanwhile, met office said heatwave is likely to persist in Odisha for two more days. Heatwave condition is expected to occur in parts of Bargarh, Balangir, Kalahandi, Nuapada and Sonepur districts on

Monday. Similarly, heatwave is likely to prevail in Bargarh, Balangir, Kalahandi, Nuapada, Sonepur and Sambalpur districts on Tuesday.

Slight relief is expected from Wednesday onwards as the met office has not forecast heatwave condition in the state for the subsequent four days. However,

hot and humid weather is expected to prevail in a few districts on Wednesday and Thursday.

As suspected sunstroke deaths have witnessed an alarming rise in the last three days, the met office cautioned that heat is a health concern for the general public, especially infants, elderly people, pregnant women and the persons who are unwell. It advised the citizens to take precautionary measures while going outside between 11 am and 3 pm.

On the day, there was a marginal drop in the mercury levels in the state. Titlagarh was the hottest at 42.5 degree Celsius, followed by Balangir and Sonepur 42.3 degree Celsius each. Bhubaneswar and Cuttack recorded 38.3 degree Celsius and 36 degree Celsius re-

spectively. With high humidity and no significant rainfall activity, citizens are facing intolerable conditions. The state has recorded 27 per cent deficit rains between May 23 and 29.



## 26 Irular houses damaged, govt seeks sponsors to repair them

AS many as 26 concrete-roof houses that were built 23 years ago for the use of the tribal people at Puliyankandi tribal hamlet, near Pollachi, in the Coimbatore district have deteriorated, posing a threat to the residents.

A few families have vacated their weak houses and started to live at temporary places away from the hamlet. Fearing that the houses may collapse any time, the residents asked the government to renovate them.

The housing conditions are indescribably bad. The concrete roofs were completely damaged and many have par-

the dam, four groups of tribal cannot shift as we cannot spend people -- Pulaiyar, Malasar, Ma- for safe housing," said A Logahamalasar and Eravallar - who nathan, president of the Pulivankandi hamlet. Loganathan added that they expect government help as they don't have the financial resources to rebuild or renovate the houses themselves. Pollachi Sub-Collector A Catherine Saranya told TNIE that they had evaluated the conditions of the houses and found that over 20 houses were in bad shape. We have sent proposals to the government asking for funds either for renovation or reconstruction of the houses. However, no developmental works would be carried out when the MCC is in force," she said. Meanwhile, sources said that the Coimbatore district administration has sought help from private players or NGOs to carry out at least the repair works under the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) funding to manage the situation as the monsoon is nearing.

THE reptile was safely handed over to Hosur District Forest Officer K Karthikeyani, after the team informed Chief Wildlife Warden Srinivas R Reddy about the incident.

Reddy told TNIE that Sikkarimedu is notorious for illegal activities involving wildlife. "Bushmeat trade usually happens in a discreet manner, through known channels. However, in this case, it is shocking to see the brazenness with which they approached strangers and offered live scheduled animals. We are working on a comprehensive plan along with the state wildlife crime control bureau to deal with the issue," he said.

DFO Karthikeyani stated that monitor lizards caught in Pudukkottai, Tiruppur and Cuddalore, are brought into Sikkarimedu for sale via public buses. It is a very organised trade, she noted.

"We have tried different methods to deter them, including creating alternative livelihoods and empowering the women in the village. In 2015-16, the state government provided funds to each family in the village to encourage them to seek out a legitimate livelihood and prevent them from hunting wild animals. We installed CCTV cameras, conducted multiple raids, arrested and imposed hefty fines on the accused. Although some change has been observed, there is a

section of people which continues to indulge in the illegal trade. Even two months ago we conducted a joint operation with police personnel and rescued a few monitor lizards from their possession," Karthikeyani said.

Furthermore, she stated that the villagers who are caught are small timers. A person by the name of Nadeson, popularly known as Apple, is the kingpin and owns sizable wealth, she claimed. "He uses village women as human shields when we try to enter the village. All transactions are done in cash leaving no digital footprint. We

Notably, a raid carried out in Sikkarimedu by forest officials in 2010, which led to the seizure of 43 monitor lizards. In 2013, 22 lizards were seized from a tribal couple near a bus stand in Krishnagiri.

tially collapsed. The roofs stood only with the steel structures inside the concrete. Similarly, pillars and walls too can collapse at any time as they have cracks. People cover the roofs with tarpaulin due to heavy water leakage during rainy days.

"Concrete roofs covered with tarpaulin are nowhere to be seen but that is the situation here with families struggling to live with children and elderly people. As the condition of the houses is deteriorating, some have vacated their houses and moved out of the hamlet seeking safe housing. Only the cattle are staying in the empty houses. As monsoon is nearing, there is a fear among the people that the houses will collapse anytime," said R Paulina, a resident.

The Puliyankandi tribal hamlet is situated three kilometres from the Aliyar dam. In 1966 during the construction of

were staying in its catchment areas were translocated to Puliyankandi, Navamalai, Panthakkal Amman Pathi, Nellithurai Mannam, Anbu Nagar and Pandiyan Pathi. Eravallar community people settled at Puliyankandi and the hamlet was adopted by the forest department for 10 years between 1995 and 2005 when the area was under the Udumalpet forest range. During the period, the people of Puliyankandi were sanctioned individual

### 'Cooked up' documents, crime scene file errors led to many acquittals

THE most common reason for city police's ganja cases falling flat before trial courts is the 'cooked up' documents. For instance, judges have routinely found that cops mentioned the crime number in the seizure mahazar — a document prepared at the crime scene — before registering the case, considered a dead giveaway of a 'false case being foisted' on the accused. Another common error is the absence of the accused's signature on the seizure mahazar. These have been sufficient for most cases to fall flat. leading to acquittals.

There are other cases where city cops have bungled up the investigation similarly. In an acquittal verdict on May 22, issued by Judge J Juliet Pushpa, the police's version of events stating that the contraband was found in the accused's 'bag', collapsed because they had not provided any details of said bag in the mahazar. In similar verdict on April 3, Judge C Thirumagal noted how the cops had created the seizure mahazar at the crime scene at 1.20 pm, registered an FIR at 3.30 pm, and the mahazar still somehow contained the FIR number. In another judgement on April 17, the judge criticised the police for admitting that the accused, a female, was searched by a male officer, which 'made a dent' in the case. Discrepancies in official versions of how the seizures were made also factor into the acquittals. In one such case, the judge noted how a police official deposed that the ganja was

seized right opposite a popular landmark, while his colleague's version was that the seizure was made in a lane beside the landmark.

Delay in producing samples to the lab and filing chargesheets within the stipulated time are also commonly cited reasons for acquittals in these cases. Advocates point to how the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, is very stringent as the prosecution must establish a prima facie case beyond rea-

BALARAMAN told TNIE that an inquiry is underway, and action will be taken based on the findings. He added that Collector Arun Thamburaj had directed the RDO to issue a show cause notice to the theatre and to take necessary measures to instruct theatre managements on the matter. Management of the New Cinema Theatre could not be reached for comment.

"This is not just about us watching a film at this theatre despite being denied tickets. We want to ensure that this behaviour is not repeated towards people like us. The government must issue an order so that we are treated with proper respect at theatres and other public places," one of the Narikuravars told reporters later. It may be recalled that last year, members of the Narikuravar community were initially refused entry to a cinema theatre in Chennai.

sonable doubt, only after which the 'reverse burden' clause onus on the accused to prove their innocence - would kick in.

Advocate Pon Prabhakaran said that police must follow procedures to obtain a conviction. "Most city cops might lack the know-how and need to be trained in these aspects. Many cases fall flat due to the benefit of doubt accorded to the accused," he noted.

A senior police official stated city police is burdened with a lot of duties and hence may make mistakes during documentation.

### **CHILD TRAFFICKING CASE: THREE** WOMEN DETAINED IN HYDERABAD

Hyderabad: The Medipally police have taken custody of three women accused in a high-profile child trafficking case. The cops will look to uncover the network of agents operating from Delhi and Pune and to identify the biological parents of the rescued children, sources said. The first arrest, on May 22, was of a registered medical practitioner (RMP), Shobha Rani, which has led to a collaboration between the Medipally and Mumbai police departments. A police officer involved in the investigation confirmed that the health of the rescued children is stable, and they are being well cared for in shelter homes. "The children will remain in the custody of these shelters for three months. If we can identify and locate their biologic al parents within this period, we will reunite them. Otherwise, they will be put up for adoption," the officer stated. Meanwhile, the Medipally police station has been inundated with calls from distressed parents inquiring about their missing children. In a parallel effort, the police are seeking custody of eight additional agents suspected of procuring, selling and transporting children from New Delhi and Mumbai to the Telugu states. ENS
